Definitions

Holistic

Synonyms: Alternative, Complementary, Traditional, Non-Conventional

Conventional

Synonyms: Allopathic, Traditional, Regular, Mainstream, "Real"



Holistic Medicine refers to looking at the whole patient and all available therapies

Therapies include:

Traditional Chinese Medicine -Acupuncture -Chinese Herbal Medicine Homeopathy Western Herbal Medicine Chiropractic Therapy Ayurvedic Medicine



Non-Conventional Therapies that are not "Holistic" (but have been labeled as holistic)

-Laser

-Supplements: Fish Oils, Glucosamine-Chondroitin, probiotics -Massage Therapy

Non-Conventional Recommendations that are not "Holistic"

-Raw Food, Boutique Foods, Homemade Foods

- -decline vaccinations
- -decline antiparaciticides



Reasons for Increase in Holistic Medicine

Public Side

Demand from the public has increased dramatically Access to information on the internet Increasingly used by people for themselves Increased access to practitioners



Professional Side

Increased availability of classes on Acupuncture, Chiropractic, Homeopathy, Herbal Medicine Public demand

Regulatory Concerns

Human-trained practitioners who want to treat animals

Veterinarians with less than adequate training

Evaluating practitioners using the best options available at the time

Evaluating practitioners using "New" or "unproven" therapies

- -possibility that it may work
- -safety factor
- -full disclosure to owner



Low amount of published research

- -Funding
- -cross-over from human research
- -Acceptance at Veterinary Schools
- increased number of Departments of Integrated Medicine at veterinary schools
